Diwali chit scam in Erode: Complaint to police

ERODE OCT 21: A female councillor of the DMK corporation who run a Diwali chit in Erode disappeared with her sons. A group of women of Valayakkara Street, Erode, came to submit a petition to Erode SP Sujatha. They were instructed to submit it at the town police station. In the petition, Erode Corporation, they alleged that 42nd Ward DMK, woman councillor Menaka - Natarajan couple and their sons Kathiresan and Babu started the weekly chit business in October 2024. They have to pay the chit money for 52 weeks. The amount is ranging



from 100 to 1,000 rupees. Since the chit was completed on September 28, they went every day to ask for money. But, the house is locked. The mobile phone number they gave has also been switched off. Steps should be taken to recover the money. Appropriate action should be taken against them, they said. During the investigation, it was found that the councillor had disappeared along with her sons and husband. Similarly, it seems that many more people have been cheated and have not been able to receive the money.

Traders plea to Minister on new vegetable trading complex

ERODE OCT 21: Details of the petition submitted by Erode Onion and Fruit Wholesale Traders Association President P K Thangaraj, Secretary R K S Tamilarasan and treasurer Udayakumar to Housing Minister Muthusamy: Association members distribute vegetables, fruits, onions, etc., ranging from about 250 tons to 300 tons per day, throughout Erode city and district. Shops of 150 square feet per person for retail trade in vegetables, fruits, etc. should be allocated in the newly constructed vegetable and fruit trading complex in Solar, Erode. There should be a separate complex for vegetables and a separate complex for fruits. Shops of at least 1000-2000 square feet should be allocated to traders doing wholesale trade. A load of products like onions or apples weighs at



least 10-20 tons. We need a 2000 square foot shop to unload and redistribute them. We cannot do business by saying that "storage of goods is done in one place and distribution is done in another place". That will create high cost of goods. Therefore, we need space to unload and distribute at the place provided to us. The corporation should provide shops directly in our names. The rent should be paid in our name and a receipt should be given. We are ready to pay a deposit for the shop. Toll collection for vehicles coming to the market should be collected on the vehicle level. Toll should not be determined on the item level. There should be a separate parking area for vehicles, a rest area for the loaders, each shop should have a separate electricity meter. Till the Solar area get developed, the rent should be fixed at a lower rate for a period of five years.

Party leaders should be allowed to speak on people's issues in the Assembly: KMDK

ERODE OCT 21: They have asked the leader of their party to speak in the Assembly with their demands for their area. That is what Mr. Velmurugan asked as a supplementary question in the Assembly. The Minister of Water Resources is experienced and senior person. It is not appropriate for him to say that a leader of a party in the Assembly should not speak for another constituency beyond his own constituency. Like him, Tamil Nadu Vazhvirimai Katchi leader Mr. Velmurugan is also experienced person in the Assembly. He leads a political party on his own. So far, no one has said that an MLA in this Assembly should not speak about another constituency. This cannot be left alone. This will become a precedent and create many problems. The Chief Minister should discuss with the Speaker of the Assembly and put an end to such incidents in the Assembly. There are people belonging to his party in Anthiyur and Bhavani areas. They have worked hard for the victory of the DMK alliance in the last Assembly elections and the Parliament elections. Mr. Duraimurugan replied that the MLA from that constituency should ask for it. Mr. Velmurugan is the leader of the political movement.

Police nab 2 terror operatives, seize rocket propelled grenade in Amritsar

CHANDIGARH, OCT 21 (PTI) Punjab Police Tuesday said they have nabbed two alleged terror operatives and seized a rocket-propelled grenade, which was intended for a "targeted terror attack". "In an intelligence-based operation, Amritsar Rural Police, in close coordination with central agencies, apprehends two terror operatives Mehakdeep Singh @ Mehak and Aditya @ Adhi from #Amritsar and recovers one Rocket Propelled Grenade (#RPG)," Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav posted on X. "Preliminary investigation reveals that the accused were in contact with #Pakistan's ISI operative who had sent the weapon, and with Harpreet Singh @ Vicky, currently lodged in #Ferozpur Jail," he said. The DGP further said the RPG was intended for a "targeted terror attack". "FIR has been registered at PS Gharinda, #Amritsar Further investigation is underway to unearth the entire network," he said. "@PunjabPoliceInD remains steadfast in its mission to dismantle transnational terror and organized crime networks sponsored by #Pakistan's ISI and maintain peace and harmony in Punjab," he said in the post.

AUT opposes Private University Amendment Bill

ERODE OCT 21: The Tamil Nadu government submitted the Private University Amendment Bill in the Legislative Assembly last Friday. The University Teachers Association has strongly opposed this. The association staged a protest in front of various government-aided colleges. At the protest held in front of Gopi Arts College, the association's fourth zone president Dr. A Balashankar said: Currently, there are about 216 government-aided colleges in Tamil Nadu. The state government is paying salaries to teachers and non-teaching staff in the college. This bill provides for converting colleges into private universities on the grounds that the financial burden is high. Accordingly, colleges with 25 acres in corporations, municipalities and town councils, 35 acres and 45 acres in gram panchayats will be upgraded to private universities. The administrators in these colleges will be declared as chancellors and vice-chancellors. Currently, student admission is done on the basis of 69 percent



reservation. That will be removed. At present, despite government restrictions, many colleges are charging extra. With that, those universities will pay salaries to the teachers. This makes paying salaries even questionable. Already, the government has not provided the job development incentive to government-aided college teachers for the last six years, but the government provides it to college teachers. Therefore, if they become universities, teachers will be further affected. The University Grants Commission of the Central Government has provided various funds to colleges for basic facilities, research, etc. Now, if they become universities, universities will collect fees for those facilities from students. This makes it a dream for poor and simple students to get higher education. Therefore, this draft bill should be completely abandoned, he said. But when they become universities, they will charge many times the fees. Currently, colleges are under the control of universities, so they are able to provide quality education. Degrees are awarded based on quality. But if colleges become universities, the quality of education will be questionable. Currently, teachers have job security. That will also be gone. Currently, teachers have to be appointed with government permission. If they become universities, teacher appointments will also be affected. Currently, the government pays salaries to teachers. Now, the government will provide a package of funds to those colleges.

FATIA seeks steps to remove anomalies in GST

ERODE OCT 21: The executive committee meeting of the Federation of All Trade and Industries Associations of Erode District (FATIA) was held in Erode. FATIA President Rajamanickam, functionaries Ravichandran, Muruganandam, Murthy, and Thulasimani were present. GST Legal Advisor Karunakaran participated as a special invitee and explained GST 2.0. In this meeting, the Federation thanked the Industrial Commissioner for consulting with the Federation's executives to select a venue for holding the buyer-seller meeting in Erode district and for deciding to announce the date for the meeting after Diwali. FATIA's demands: property tax has been increased by 6 percent every year. The Tamil Nadu government should take steps to reduce property tax. The tax collection in the name of trade license should be avoided. North Indian food items such as chapati, parotta, and appalam have been completely tax exempted. So, the Union Finance Minister should take steps to exempt South Indian food items such as idli and dosa, which are the symbols of Tamil Nadu, from VAT. The GST Act stipulates that if the weight of a package of grains like rice is more than 25 kg, there is no tax and if it is less than 25 kg, GST should be paid. It is a tax imposed on the poor and underprivileged. GST should be removed from other types of food and grains. Manufacturers of notebooks and graph paper have been exempted from VAT on paper. GST on paper is also exempted when sellers sell notebooks to schools and colleges. However, tax is levied on notebooks, exercise notebooks and paper sold by sellers to the public. There is a tax of 18 percent on uncounted paper and graph paper. In this regard, the confusions in the government order should be clarified and all papers should be exempted from VAT.

AIBEA call to nationalise pvt sector banks

ERODE OCT 21: All India Bank Employees Association (AIBEA) chairman CH Venkatchalam said the union will take out a march to Parliament on Dec 10 to press the Centre to nationalise all private sector banks in the nation to protect the interest of public. To highlight the problems of the staff and public, the union led by district president Narasimhan, staged a demo at Erode. Venkatchalam said that due to the neo-liberal economic policies, not only the public sector banks, even the private sector banks are facing challenges as evidenced in the take-over of Lakshmi Vilas Bank by DBS Bank of Singapore, allowing major capital investment in



CSB Bank by Fair Fax from Canada, attempts to sell IDBI Bank to some foreign investor, RBI's permission to Japanese banking major Sumitomo Mitsui Banking Corp (SMBC) to inject Rs 16,000 crore (\$1.83 billion)

into Yes Bank to pave the way for SMBC eventually taking an ownership role, etc. Attempts were made to sell Nainital Bank to some private investor. Hence, the policy is to privatise the public sector and foreignise the private sector banks. So, all the existing private banks should be nationalized. The attacks on the private banks are increasing with a view to frustrate the workforce to succumb to these adverse machinations. Despite efforts from AIBEA, the victimisation in Federal Bank eludes an amicable solution. In CSB Bank, the employees have so far been denied the benefit of 11th and 12th wage Settlements. Similarly most of the private banks have not extended the Ex-gratia pension to the retirees. Instead of employing regular permanent employees under IBA pattern, private banks are employing C2C officers and contract officers. The staff should fight for adequate recruitment of regular employees, he said.

Mother, daughter drown while bathing in Ganga in UP's Kannauj

KANNAUJ (UP), OCT 21 (PTI) A woman and her 15-year-old daughter drowned while bathing in the Ganga River in this Uttar Pradesh district on Monday, police said. The incident took place at Faraharan under the Gursahaiganj police station area, when Preeti Mishra (35) and her daughter Nisha (15) went to take a bath in Ganga near their village, where two other women were also bathing, local SHO Kapil Dubey said. While taking bath, Nisha reportedly slipped and was swept into deep water. In an attempt to save her, Preeti too got carried away by the strong current. After local villagers raised an alarm, divers were called in who found the bodies about 2 km downstream, the SHO said.
